

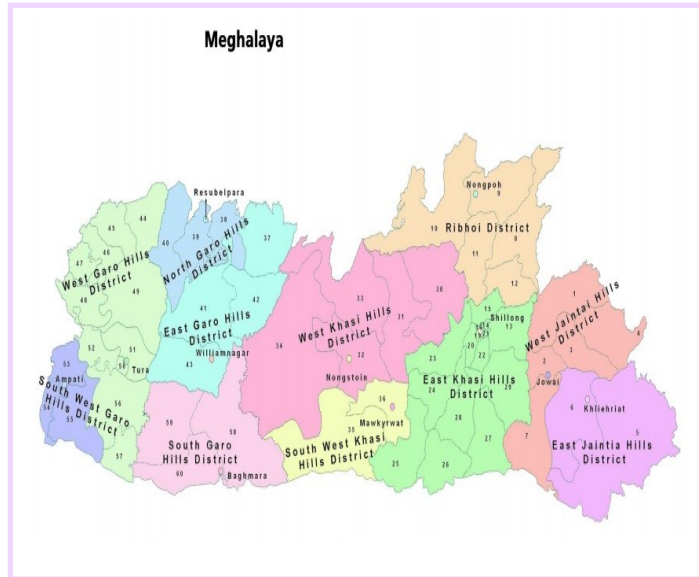

Pictured above are the **11** districts of Meghalaya. Meghalaya is a state in northeastern India. The population of Meghalaya is estimated to be 3,211,474. Tribal people make up the majority of the population. The Khasis are the largest group, followed by the Garos then the Jaintias. Other groups include the Hajongs, the Koches and related Rajbongshis, the Boros, Dimasa, Kuki, Lakhar, Tiwa (Lalung), Karbi, Rabha and Nepali.

English is the official language of the state. The most spoken languages in Meghalaya are **Khasi** and **Garo** followed by **Pnar**, **Bengali**, **Nepali**, **War**, **Hindi**, **Hajong** and **Assamese**. English is spoken as a common language across the diverse ethnic and demographic groups. In urban centers most of the people can speak English; rural residents vary in their ability.
